Content Specialist

The Baton Rouge Youth Coalition seeks two hardworking, passionate, effective educators to serve as part-time content specialists, who will support our high school-age youth with humanities and STEM schoolwork.

Baton Rouge Youth Coalition Overview

BRYC is an after-school program that prepares high-achieving, under-resourced high school students – whom we call “Fellows” – to enter, excel in, and graduate from college so they can become full participants in society. We offer programming between 5:30-8:30pm, Monday through Wednesday, and otherwise as needed. Our programs run from the beginning of August through the end of May.

Position Overview

BRYC seeks two part-time content specialists, one who specializes in humanities and the other in STEM disciplines, to assist our Fellows with schoolwork and assessment preparation and reinforce the self-regulatory learning model BRYC teaches. Reporting to BRYC’s underclassmen learning manager, the content specialists should be strong not only in their given content area but also in their ability to relate to and connect with high school-age youth and help maintain a safe, orderly, and productive educational environment. Simply put, we are looking for super-tutors.

Schedule

The specialists will attend 5-10 hours of training in early August, with programs starting on August 19. There will 30-33 weeks of programming between August 19, 2019 and May 7, 2020. On a normal week, the specialists will provide content support Monday through Wednesday from 5:30-8:30pm. By mid-July, BRYC’s director of curriculum will provide the specialists with a detailed, week-by-week schedule. We are open to considering candidates who could only attend one or two of the three days.

Compensation

The specialists will earn \$10 hourly when providing content support and \$8 hourly when engaged in training or non-program activities.

Qualifications

The content specialists should:

- Be exceptionally strong in their given content area (i.e. humanities and/or STEM) up to and beyond high school-level concepts
- Have a track record of effective one-on-one and small-group instruction
- Have a track record of building strong rapport with high school-age youth
- Preferred: minimum of a bachelor’s degree
