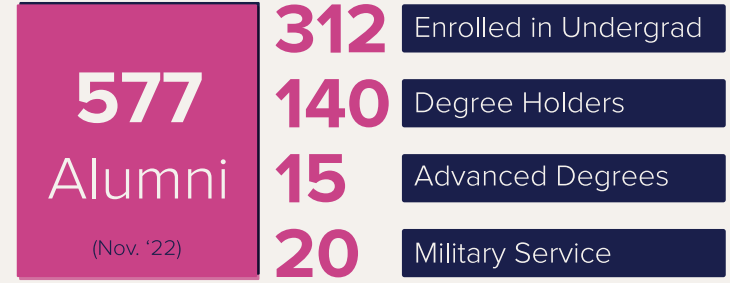




MISSION & VISION

Emphasize smooth matriculation and freshman-to-sophomore year retention, which strongly predict persistence.



JOIN FORCES

Collaborate with LSU, Southern, BRCC, and the UL System to support our shared students, as set forth in formal agreements.



PRIORITIZE NEED

Collect and respond to monthly "pulse surveys" gauging College Fellows' academic, financial, and socioemotional well-being.



LAUNCH CAREERS

Position graduates for post-college success through job sourcing, application prep, and relevant professional introductions.



STAY CONNECTED

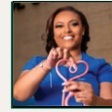
Keep BRYC Alumni meaningfully involved through volunteerism, twice-annual events, exclusive scholarships, and monthly newsletters.

POWER PLAYERS

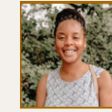

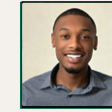

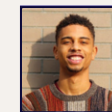
